**SCIENCE CENTER TO PRESENT 21+ GLASS WITH LOCAL GLASS COMPANY**  
***PITTSBURGH GLASS CENTER OFFERING TILE-MAKING SESSIONS***

**PITTSBURGH, Nov. 5, 2014** — Carnegie Science Center will team up with Pittsburgh Glass Center to host 21+ Glass on Friday, Nov. 14, from 6 – 10 pm.

Visitors will learn about the science of melting glass with artists from the Pittsburgh Glass Center. For an additional fee, guests will have the opportunity to make their own colorful fused-glass tile. Tiles will be fired at the Pittsburgh Glass Center and available for pick-up at their location in Pittsburgh's East End.

As always, 21+ Night features live music, cash bars, and the chance to experience four floors of hands-on exhibits – with no kids! Exhibits include BLUE!, SpacePlace, RoboWorld, and Zap! Surgery. Participants get a discount on Omnimax films and laser shows that evening.

Cost is just \$10 for tickets purchased by noon the day of the event, or \$15 if purchased at the door. The glass workshop is an additional \$15. Attendees receive \$15 in free slot play at Rivers Casino upon check in, while supplies last.
